
Happy New Year from Sonnenberg Gardens

We met with contractors to repair the Charlotte Street entrance gates which will be completed by opening day! The new tram stop in front of the Rest House was also established this past month.

Also, we are engaging Break The Ice Media to help launch the capital campaign for the building fund and we continue with the testing of a new volunteer software program that we are excited to launch in 2022.
